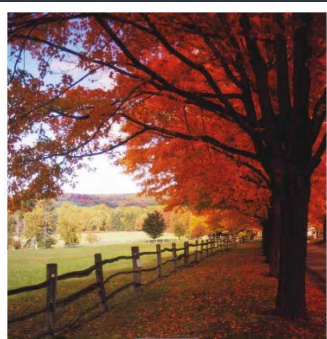

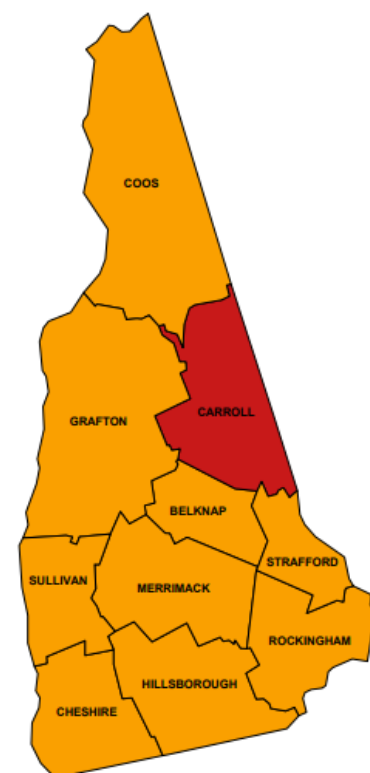
New Hampshire Cancer Control Plan

New Hampshire Enacted Legislation

New Hampshire Revised Statutes § 125:9 Requires the Department of Health and Human Services to investigate complaints of poor indoor air quality and to conduct inspections of buildings and dwellings, upon request, for the presence of radon or other health hazards in indoor air. Also requires the department to provide education, technical consultation, and recommendations for abatement of such health hazards in conjunction with the University of New Hampshire cooperative extension service.

New Hampshire Revised Statutes § 310-A:189-a Requires that those who design or install radon mitigation systems be certified with the National Radon Proficiency Program or the National Radon Safety Board. Requires the state Board of Home Inspectors to provide notice of this requirement on its website.

New Hampshire Revised Statutes § 477:4-a Requires that prior to executing a contract for the sale of real property, the seller must provide buyer with a statement about radon and radon testing and mitigation techniques.

New Hampshire Revised Statutes §§ 10-B:1--B:4 Requires the Department of Administrative Services to adopt clean air standards that must be met in buildings purchased, renovated or leased by the state. Provides that the department is responsible for certifying that buildings
